

As a solo-artist and group performer, Taylor continues to win loyal fans, climbing to #1 on the Reverb Nation World Music chart for the Raleigh, Durham, and Wake Forest Areas.

Eugene Taylor has used his talents and gifting in music to touch the lives of the patients he routinely transports at UNC Rex Healthcare. Additionally, while transporting patients, Taylor taps out soothing rhythms on a small drum which he carries with him everywhere he goes. In addition to playing for patients, Eugene has performed at Rex's annual Cancer Survivor's Day, Rex's Annual Golf Opening, and Rex's Kids Can! support group for children who have a parent or loved one with cancer.

Anointed, healing, soothing, touching, genius, are just a few of the ways patients and fellow artists have come to regard Eugene Taylor. That is why he's been christened the "Drum Prophet" and "Wellness Ambassador" by family and friends. The names just seemed to fit and other healthcare providers and health organizations have requested the "Wellness Ambassador's" services. Taylor has also played for the NC Comprehensive Cancer Center, the Susan G. Komen Foundation, Relay for Life, and the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. He also routinely provides music and movement and wellness services to nursing homes, assistant living facilities, substance abuse and recovery centers, and health rehabilitation centers.

Taylor's musical talents are fit for any and all venues. He's also a sought after motivational speaker, and has been hired by US Foods, America's second largest food distributor, to encourage and motivate its sales team. Taylor has been booked for weddings, schools, work-retreats, family reunions, book clubs, art festivals, and fashion shows. He's performed at churches and community events.
